



It's about speech - not CSI

UNK forensics team showcases speaking skills

The UNK forensics team showed off their skills at a UNK Forensics Showcase on Mon., April 23, 2007 in the Mitchell Communications Center.

Six events were presented for the enjoyment of faculty, students, family and friends.

Brandon Pettigrew, political science major from Kearney, performed an After Dinner Speech about environmental conservation. This event is typically similar to a persuasive speech but includes more humorous elements. This selection went on to compete at the national forensics competition this month.

Grant Campbell, an education major from Tecumseh, staged his Prose Interpretation, a more serious selection, titled "A Smile on Happy Chang's Face," by Tom Perotta. Campbell explained, "This piece is about coming to terms with what you're given when you expected something else."

Explaining how he chose this piece, Campbell said that the UNK forensics director, Rachelle Kamrath, found it and saw that the main character, an umpire, matched Campbell's personality and presence well. It resulted in being a good fit, as he took the piece to compete at nationals this month.

Also performing a nationally competitive piece, Kenny

Hopkinson delivered a gripping presentation of the prose piece "An Unfortunate Woman." This selection was of a man's letters to a friend who had recently hung herself.

Hopkinson and Campbell performed a Duo Interpretation of Prose through the selection referred to as "Damage Control." This piece included excerpts of various apologies from public figures such as former president Clinton and President George W. Bush as Hopkinson's character was preparing to share his own apology draft-

ed by his aide, acted by Campbell.

On a less dramatic note, but still continuing on to nationals, Jeralynn Stanton presented an Informative speech on bioluminescence and how this process is used in animal experimentation. The speech was accompanied with several visual aid displays to emphasize the points made.

Following Stanton's speech, forensics director, Rachelle Kamrath, explained the extensive research involved with putting together a nationally competitive speech. This process included corre-

sponding directly with professionals in the field as primary resources to provide the technical jargon and details that made Stanton's piece so successful.

One piece was completely different from the standard speeches. Christi Sedrel showcased her abilities in the Impromptu category. This event requires competitors to draw out two random quotations, and in a matter of seven minutes, to prepare and present a selection based on the one quote chosen from the two.

Sedrel had a choice between a quote by Mitchell Caplan, "To succeed as a team is to hold all of the members accountable for their expertise," and the quote that she selected, by Christine Bovee, "Doubt whom you will, but never yourself."

When asked what one of her favorite parts of being involved with the UNK forensics team, Sedrel smiled and said, "Having something to do on the weekends." And as forensics team assistant coach, Abby Kovanda explained, the weekends are virtually all filled. During the 17 weekends between September 15, 2006 and April 21, 2007, 27 competitive tournaments are held.

Team members are well prepared for the tournaments. In fact, Kamrath explained that all events, excluding the Impromptu category, are required to remain strictly under 10 minutes. If a competitor finishes even one second over the limit, the speech is disqualified. By tournament time, each competitor has practiced so thoroughly that the same time limit, between 9:30 and 9:45, is hit each performance.

Loper baseball

2007 season coming to an end

This past weekend, the Lopers baseball team hosted the Plains Division leader Colorado State-Pueblo at Memorial Field.

In the first of a four game RMAC series, the Thunderwolves increased their lead over the Lopers in the Plains Division standings.

CSUP not only stopped a six game UNK winning streak, but also gave junior Seth Svoboda of Kearney, his first loss after five straight wins. Svoboda is now 0-2 against Pueblo this season.

Svoboda did get out of a bases loaded jam in the first with a strike out of Nick Runstadler. After CSUP catcher Adam Auer hit his first homer of the year with one out in the second, Manny Madrid walked and Doug Hurst struck out.

That's when Pueblo's bats got going, registering four straight hits and three for extra bases. The set featured a total of five runs and a two run dinger by Nick Castellanos.

Senior lefty Cody Hovestad, of Swift Current, Sask., then held Pueblo scoreless the next three innings. During that time, he fanned two and got one double play.

However, UNK couldn't solve Pueblo starter Nate Whitworth or reliever Jesus Rodriguez. Over the

first seven innings, the Lopers managed just four hits and one run.

Lincoln sophomore, Nate Swearer (3 for 5, three RBIs) got UNK on the board with a run scoring single in the sixth and then junior lefty Joe Nowaczkyk, Gretna, hit a three run homer to left to highlight a four run seventh.

Also for the Lopers, Omaha senior Cody Lusero went 3 for 4 and Gothenburg sophomore Luke Edson was effective in a long relief role.

For Pueblo, Auer was just a triple shy of hitting for the cycle and was one of four other players to have two RBI's. He came into the game with only one extra base hit all spring.

On Saturday, a day with the wind blowing out to left field, Colorado State-Pueblo got late inning home runs from Ryan Castellanos and Adam Auer to sweep a double header from UNK, 10-8 and 9-7.

Thanks to two home runs from Gretna junior, Joe Nowaczkyk, UNK battled back from deficits of 3-1 and 6-2 in game one.

The second dinger tied the game in the fifth and Lincoln sophomore, Brad Hull hit a two out single to give the Lopers a 7-6 lead.

However, the lead was short lived as Pueblo scored four times in the sixth. The big blow was a three run shot from Castellanos. He also homered Friday night, and then

went yard in the second game.

Also for the T-Wolves, Auer went 4 for 4 with one run and two RBIs. On Friday night, he also was 4 for 4.

UNK managed to get the catcher out the first two times he was up in game two, but Auer then hit a double down the right field line to reach base again. The Canadian then hit a one out homer in the seventh inning to break a seven all tie.

Auer is now 10 for 12 in the series with five extra base hits, 3 doubles and 2 homers. He came into the series with one extra base hit and a double for the entire year.

UNK used the long ball to score a majority of its runs. Going deep in the game were Colorado senior, Ryan Bucher, Lincoln sophomore, Nate Swearer and Blair sophomore, Kyle Smith.

Grossmont, Calif., senior lefty Paul Schleifer suffered the loss but threw his third complete game of the year. He fanned three and gave up eight earned runs on 15 hits and five walks.

The final game of the series was cancel due to the rain that fall Saturday night.

The Lopers will be in action this weekend again at home hosting the Regis Rangers. The first pitch will be at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, but prior to first pitch, the Lopers will be honoring the 1967 UNK baseball team.
