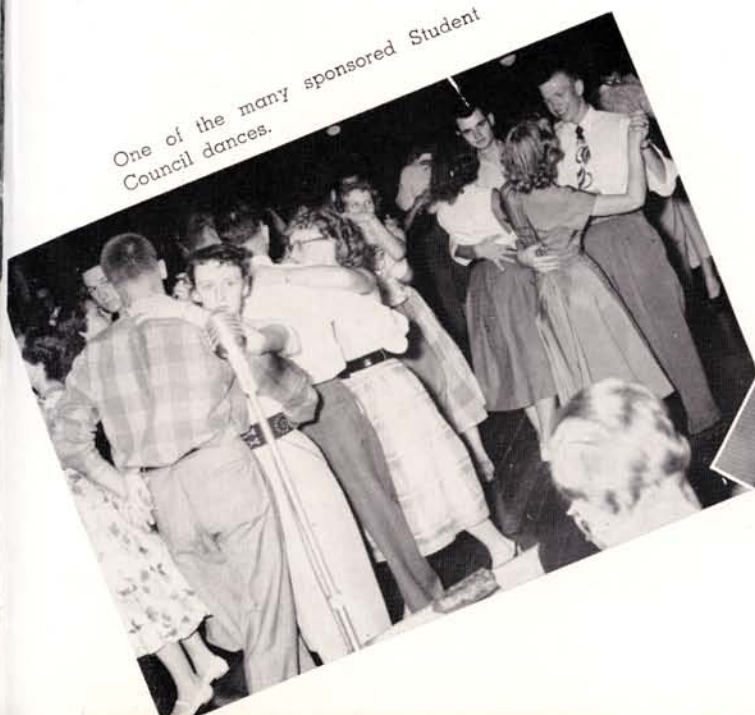

The Kearney eleven, the Antelope football squad, added their bit to the success of the day, with a ten-to-nothing victory over the Chadron State Eagles.

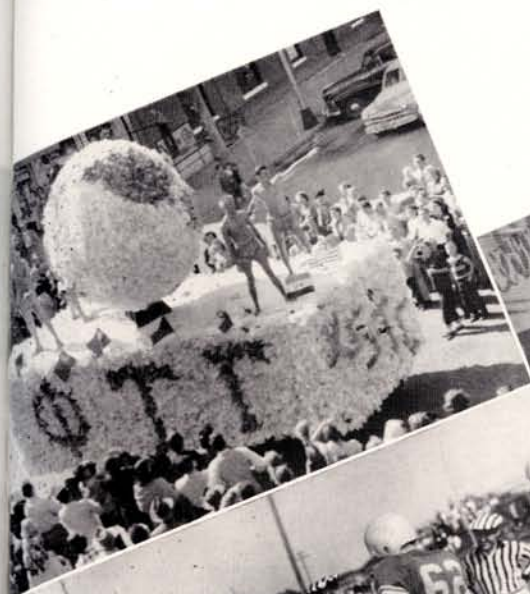

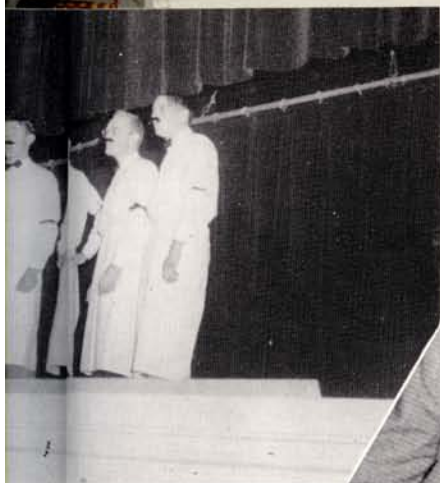

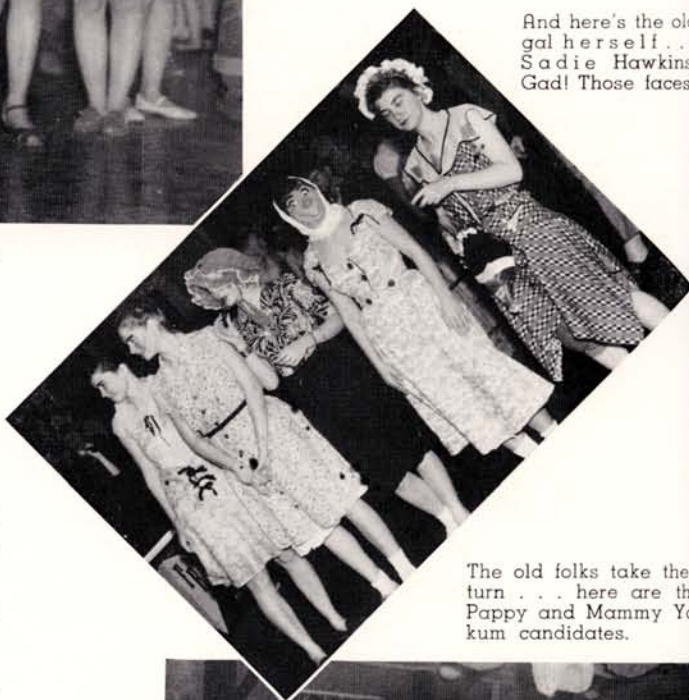
Colleges throughout the country have observed Sadie Hawkin's Day since cartoonist Al Capp created the idea in his Lil Abner comic strip.

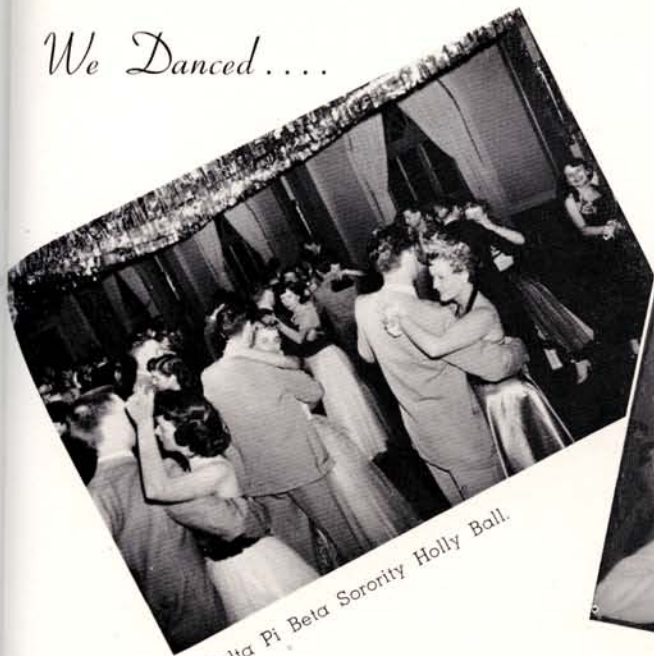

PERU DOWNS KEARNEY 13-7

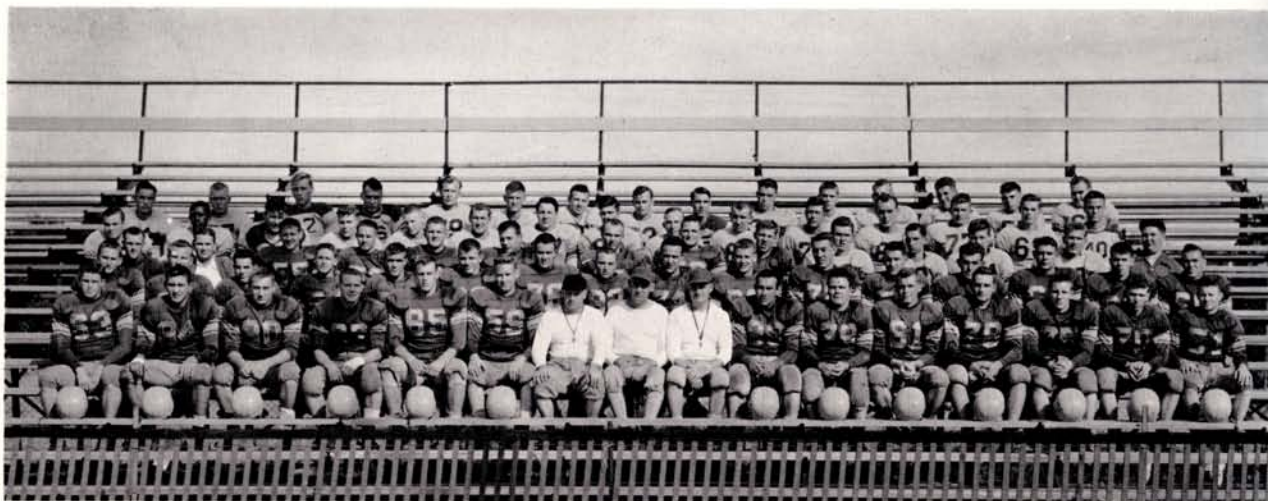

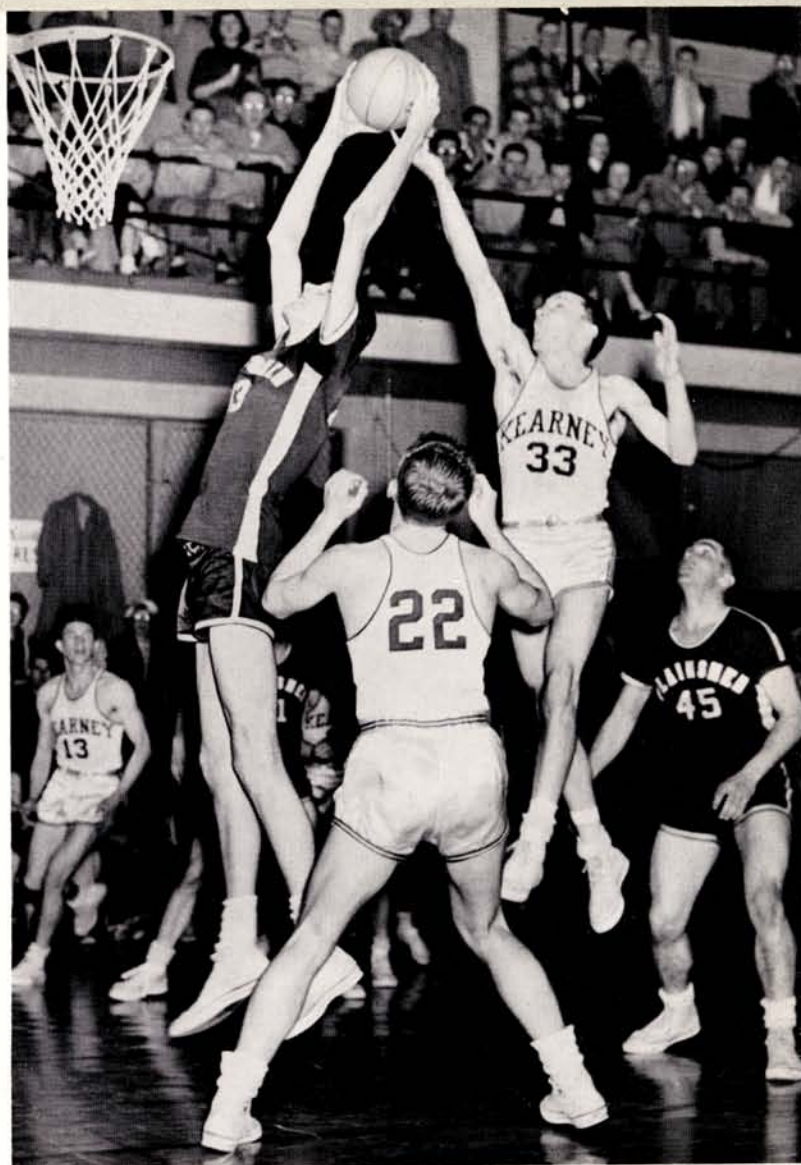
