IN MEMORIAM

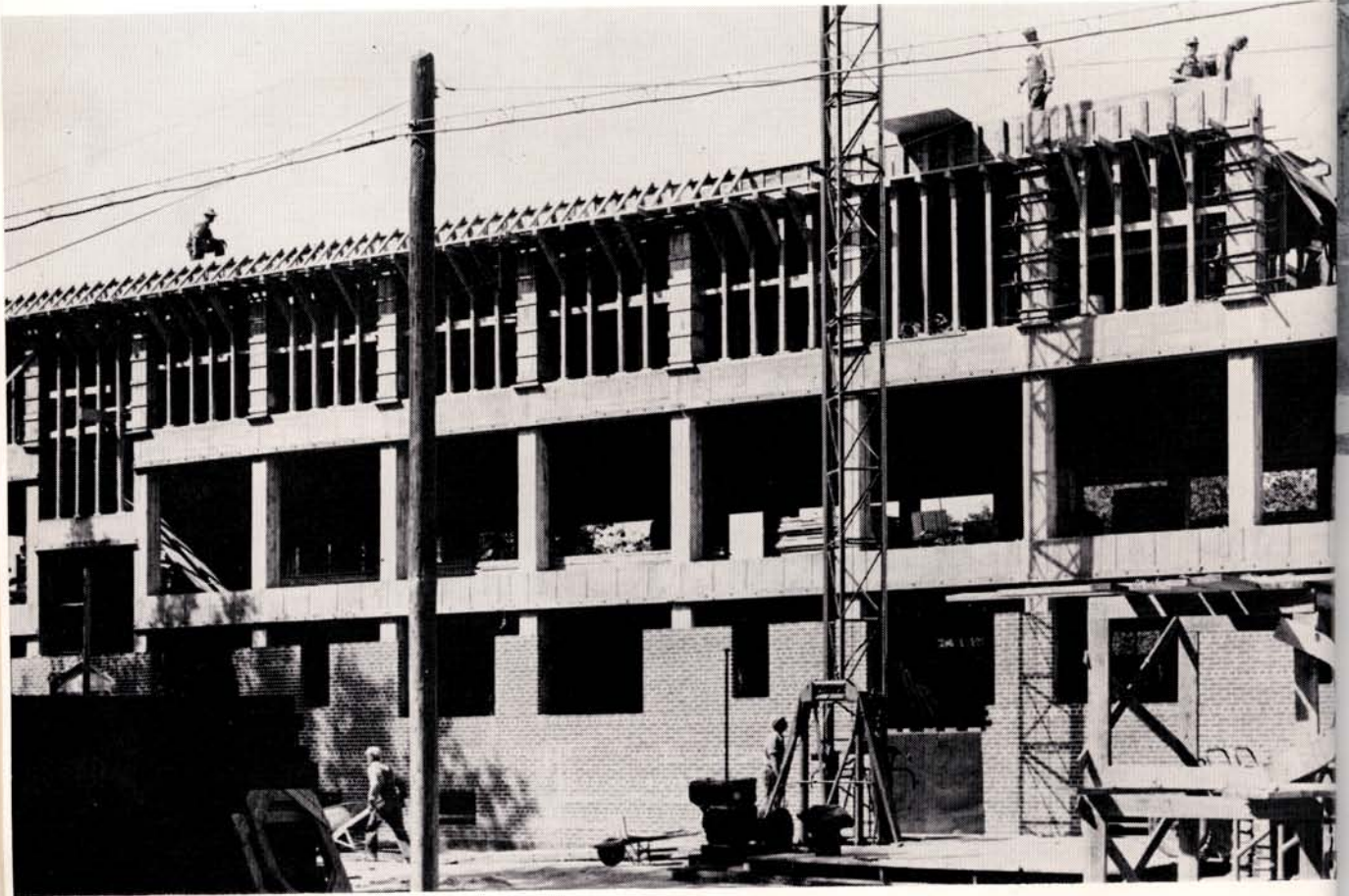


Joseph L. Bowes

We sincerely hope you enjoy the **1954 Blue and Gold**.

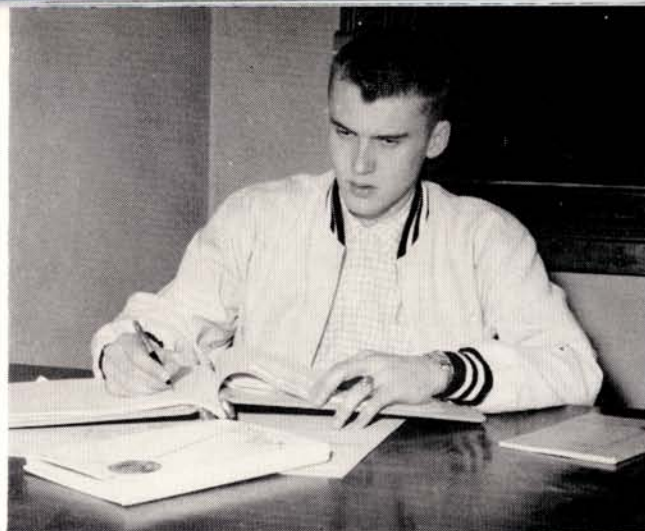

The Antelopes upset Hastings 26-7. This victory was the first for Kearney over the Broncs since 1948 when Kearney won 6-0.

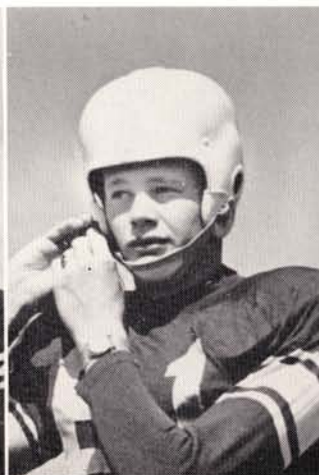
